Local(ish) Summer Programs

American Legion CT State Police Youth Week

The American Legion Department of Connecticut and the Connecticut State Police, announce their joint sponsorship of the Annual State Police Youth Week. The program, a law enforcement practicum for high school students completing their JUNIOR YEAR at an accredited high school in the state of Connecticut, will be held at the State Police Training Academy in Meriden, CT. Bard College at Simon's Rock - Young Writers Workshop

The <u>Young Writers Workshop</u> is a three-week creative writing program for students currently completing grades 9,10 and 11. Unlike more traditional workshops in creative writing, the Young Writers Workshop focuses on using informal, playful, and expressive writing as a way to strengthen skills of language and thinking. Out of these informal writing activities, using techniques of peer response, students develop more polished pieces, ranging from personal narratives to short stories, poems, brief dramatic works, and experiments in creative nonfiction.

Bard College at Simon's Rock - Curiosity Camp (campus closing June 2025)

Two week exploration of college living and learning designed for students currently completing grades 9, 10 and 11. Curiosity Camp at Simon's Rock is open to inquisitive and motivated students interested in exploring their academic and creative interests in a college environment while they are currently completing grades 9, 10 or 11. Students will participate daily in Simon's Rock's signature Writing and Thinking Workshop along with a Seminar, and arts and science courses to experience diverse and exciting academic offerings. The program's cohort of 30 students allows for small class sizes where students and professors can collaborate and engage in dynamic discourse in this academic summer camp.

Buck's Rock Performing Arts Camp

<u>Buck's Rock Camp</u> is a freedom-of-choice creative and performing arts camp for teenagers ages 10 to 17. Every summer at Buck's Rock is completely different. The campers who join us each year make the summer their own adventure, and the camp constantly evolves and changes to meet the needs of that year's campers.

Assumption Pre-College Program Worcester, MA

Each summer, high school students from across New England and around the country join Assumption University professors for a competitive pre-college program that introduces rising high school seniors to undergraduate studies in the liberal arts. Participating students gain firsthand experience of studying the humanities in a college setting. Our Pre-College Program gives high school students the opportunity to study

great works of philosophy, literature, art, political science, and theology with nationally known faculty as they simultaneously meet new friends and experience what collegiate academic life is like.

Barnard College Pre-college Program New York, NY

Experience Summer in New York City at Barnard. With distinct programs to choose from, ranging from entrepreneurship to STEM, you have the unique opportunity to explore an area of interest on a deeper level through both in-class discussions and city exploration. As part of the learning experience at Barnard, you will get a taste of both college life and the city that never sleeps!

Boston University Pre-college program Boston, MA

Illuminate your future this summer at Boston University. BU's long-running Summer Term pre-college offerings include a choice of one-, two-, three-, and six-week programs, where you can participate remotely from anywhere in the world. Our programs for high school students prepare you for success in college. With five exciting and challenging pre-college summer programs to choose from, you can earn college credit, discover a new subject area, perform cutting-edge research in University labs, or immerse yourself in project-based learning. Summer is a great time to push yourself academically while experiencing college life in this new normal, making new friends, and engaging in remote social activities. We invite you to join other motivated teens from 50 states and 87 countries in our summer programs for high school students - a great introduction to college life and academics.

Carleton Liberal Arts Experience Northfield, MN

The <u>Carleton Liberal Arts Experience (CLAE)</u> is a free, in-person, week-long summer academic program for high school students. CLAE supports 52 high school students who have just completed their sophomore year. CLAE Scholars experience the benefits of a liberal arts college education through classes in science, art, social studies, and technology. Students from across the country are invited to apply for this academic program. CLAE is intended for students who identify as Black or African American, or who have an interest in African American culture. Throughout the week, scholars will focus on African American community and identity through the framework of a liberal arts education.

Carnegie Mellon Pre-college program Pittsburgh, PA

Online Academic Information: In Pre-College Summer Session, high-school students enroll in CMU college courses, earning college credit and receiving a Carnegie Mellon transcript. Courses are from subjects across the entire university, including in science, humanities, social science, engineering, computer science, and technology applied to the arts. The courses are the same ones taken during the fall and spring by Carnegie Mellon students, usually in their first year or as sophomores. Pre-College Summer Session students enroll in one or two courses, which typically also enroll undergraduate students. The program is therefore appropriate for students who will be returning to high school, yet who are ready to take the challenge of fast-paced summer college courses within a supportive and welcoming environment.

Clarkson University, The Clarkson School Young Scholars Program, Potsdam, NY

This program is for motivated and talented students who will be high school sophomores, juniors, seniors, and first-year college students, including The Clarkson School students. In general, <u>The Young Scholars Program</u> provides a unique summer experience for students. Consistent with Clarkson's overall focus on interdisciplinary education, students are given a problem to examine and solve from three different perspectives. This year's project is "Designing a Sustainable and Scalable Portfolio for Financial Wellness".

Emerging Rural Leaders Program at University of Chicago, Chicago, IL

A lower-cost program for students in 9th, 10th, or 11th grades. Through readings, lectures, discussion, and hands-on activities, students will learn about developing leadership skills and about the process for highly selective universities with the guidance of UChicago admissions counselors. Students will also be exposed to the kinds of opportunities available in a large urban center for academic work and professional development (as well as just for fun!) through activities that showcase the city of Chicago. The program will be hosted on-campus,

and program participants must reside in campus housing for the duration of the program. Financial aid is available.

EXPLO Summer Programs, Wellesley, MA

EXPLO is a non-profit organization offering personalized academic enrichment programs where smart, curious students in grades 7, 8, and 9 step outside of their comfort zones, grasp the power of their potential, and embrace their ability to shape the future. Overnight and day options are offered.

Landmark College, Putney, VT

Landmark College offers summer programs to assist a wide range of students with learning differences, including high school students, graduating high school seniors, and students enrolled at colleges around the country. All of the programs are designed to enable students to identify their learning strengths and differences. Students learn specific strategies to be successful in formal academic settings and grow personally and academically in an intentional and supportive academic community. The instructors consist of current Landmark College faculty as well as teachers from the surrounding area who are experienced in working with students who learn differently.

Smith Pre-college programs, Northampton, MA

Designed by Smith's professors and staff, precollege programs offer an inspiring learning experience, and you can request a recommendation from Smith faculty to use in your college applications. A hands-on, collaborative environment lets you directly engage with world-class scholars who help you pursue your passions and develop new skills. Enjoy learning without the pressure of grades or competition. Outside the classroom (whether it be remote or on campus), enjoy Smith's social offerings in the evenings and on weekends. Remote learners will have multiple options every week to take part in creative, health and wellness, and social online activities. On-campus students will live in a house just a few steps from downtown Northampton and will have the same opportunities in person.

University of California - Santa Barbara Summer Programs for High School Students

These summer programs provide students with a unique opportunity to gain university-level research experience and earn college credit.

Maine College of Art & Design Pre-College Program, Portland, ME

Our Pre-College program is a three-week experience designed to help you discover what life would be like for you as an undergraduate student at Maine College of Art & Design. During Pre-College, you develop your admissions portfolio, develop language for artistic critiques, earn college credits, make friends with peers from around the country, and work alongside fantastic professional artists and designers! Maine Media Academy, Rockport, ME

MIAD's Pre-College Program is a series of <u>weekend</u> and <u>summer classes</u> devoted to developing high school students' artistic skills and preparing them for an art and design college. Classes are available for high school freshman through senior year.

Pratt Pre-college Program

PreCollege programs support future artists, designers, and creative thinkers to develop their skills and creative voice. High school students engage in rigorous college-level courses, modeled after Pratt Institute's undergraduate offerings, and taught by Pratt faculty who are committed to sharing their expertise in the fields of art and design. Students enrolled in credit-bearing PreCollege classes receive elective credits accepted at Pratt and most other colleges and universities. PreCollege students have the opportunity to: Experience studying art, design, architecture, or creative writing at a college level. Build skills using a variety of tools, materials, and techniques. Develop a body of work to build a college admissions portfolio. Join a community of students who share your interests. Explore undergraduate majors and get a preview of the college experience at Pratt.

RISD Pre-College Program, Providence, RI

Writing

Fir Acres Writing Workshop at Lewis & Clark College, Portland, OR

Two weeks to write and join a community of writers on the beautiful, wooded campus of Lewis & Clark College in Portland, Oregon. In daily Workshops, participants study great writing and produce their own under the guidance of dynamic, thoughtful, published faculty. At night, participants gather to socialize, meet and hear from distinguished visiting writers, and work on their own poetry, fiction, and creative prose.

Reynolds Young Writers Workshop at Denison University, Granville, OH

Every summer for more than two decades, talented high school juniors and seniors to-be have been welcomed to Denison University in Granville, Ohio, for the acclaimed Reynolds Young Writers Workshop. The workshop is an eight-day residential program that incorporates small creative writing workshops, group sessions with Denison creative writing faculty and notable visiting writers, and much more. If considering a gap year after graduation, <u>City Year</u> could be an option to consider. Part of AmeriCorp and working with students in diverse school settings. Applications considered on a rolling basis, and you can even applying using the common Application if you've already got an account.

Gap Year Association

Lists <u>programs that adhere to the Gap Year Association accreditation standards</u>, which is recognized by the US Department of Justice and US Federal Trade Commission. You can also find a list of all programs affiliated with GYA.

IFYE USA International Exchange (19 years old and up)

The IFYE foreign exchange program is for individuals 19 and older and may last two, three, or six months. As a participant in the program, you'll live and work as part of the family. You'll also move to a new family every three to five weeks, so you're able to gain a broader perspective about life in your host country.

Inspiring Girls Expeditions

We offer tuition-free field expeditions and virtual programs for high school girls* to empower them to lead and succeed through science, art, and outdoor exploration. Applicants must be 16-18 years old on June 1 of the expedition year, and currently enrolled in high school (including graduating in the spring before expeditions start). *We welcome cis girls and trans girls, as well as non-binary and gender non-conforming youth to our programs.

NOLS Wilderness School

Find adventure and perspective. Develop lifelong leadership skills as you dive into our time-tested curriculum. Build courage and competence under the guidance of the best instructors in the industry. A NOLS course is an immersive expedition where you will spend time exploring remote, wild places with a tight-knit community of students and instructors. No experience is required, but by the end you'll have the skills and experiences to be a leader. On the expedition page filter by date to find summer options.
